Lately I have been thinking a lot about "tolerance." It seems our world on the whole is not as tolerant as perhaps it should be. No blame here, just acknowledging a reality. I feel we readily draw sides and have become less able to dialogue compassionately and courteously than we should be. Intolerance and the inability to discuss topics appropriately is dangerous. In an effort to encourage each of us, I have updated an article I wrote from last year. I believe it is fitting for both our world and a good reminder to our community here:

In some studying I was doing not too long ago, I came across the rather long and daunting phrase: "hermeneutic of generosity." It is a term coined by Dr. Paul Farmer, founder of Partners in Health, and an infectious disease specialist, who has worked in many poor countries like Haiti. He coined this term to mean the following: "interpreting the intentions, actions, and statements of others in a favorable light." Basically, I see this as a compassionate way of living in which we immediately and regularly see others in a positive and hopeful way. It means that when someone says something to us, our first inkling is that what they are saying is positive, hopeful, and said to make us and our lives better (i.e. filled with compassion) — even if it doesn't seem so on the surface. A hermeneutic of generosity leads us to hold others in a positive way, so that what we hear them say or what we see them do sounds and looks like life-giving love. It's giving them the benefit of the doubt.

This hermeneutic of generosity is a way of living our lives compassionately, so when someone doesn't show up for an appointment our first assumption is that they have a very good reason; and instead of getting angry at them, we pray they are okay. It means that when we receive an email that "sounds mean and angry" that we assume they were having trouble putting their thoughts into writing and that we will not read anything negative into what is written. It means when someone uses the wrong coffee pot at fellowship hour or someone near us sings off key or someone doesn't understand what we are explaining, we give it to God and let it go without a word. A hermeneutic of generosity helps us see others with the heart of God — a heart that loves first, last, and foremost.

Let me encourage you to practice this hermeneutic of generosity. Before you read your emails, tell yourself that you will interpret everything that is written in a positive light. Before you head off to work, tell yourself that you will give everyone the benefit of the doubt today — in all they say and do. When talking to your spouse or children or friends, assume that they care deeply about you; that you trust and respect them and know that what they say or do at this moment comes from a place of love and concern. Before you say that thing that just popped into your head, ask yourself if this is a healing or hurting thing to say. And then see what happens. See what happens to you — but also see what happens to them. It is amazing what happens when we treat others with compassion and tolerance.

# HEALTH AWARENESS AND HEALING SUNDAY Sunday, February 11, 2018


In today's society, there is an increasing need to remember self-care practices and to take care of ourselves. This worship service is a reminder of that message.

#### FOOD SHELF NEEDS AND PLEA FOR HELP

The current list of needs includes: Canned Meats (Chicken, Spam, Hash, Stews, Chili), Peanut Butter, and Jams/Jellies; or TOPS Gift Cards. See Jean Schult or Andy Resch with questions.

According to Steve Brown, chair of the Food Shelf, there are over 100 families that depend upon the Food Shelf for assistance. Families can only call the food shelf once every 60 days, and a maximum of 4x per year.

Deliveries include an average of \$200 worth of food (\$40 of which are gift cards for perishables) for a family of 4. A family of 2 gets about 60% of that. The average family asks for assistance about 2 or 3 times.

If you know of anyone that needs food assistance and resides in the Spencerport School District, have them call 277-4917 for assistance.

The Food Shelf is also looking for new driver volunteers to make the deliveries. Most of the existing driver volunteers are around 75-80 yrs old. There is no set schedule for deliveries, so even if you have a job, you can still help volunteer. 
