Folks,

Please find below the Mission Statement completed by the Mission Study Team (Dawn Sheffet, Harry Pittman, Cindy Anderson, Dennis Dupree, and Pastor Tedd) and approved by Session. This document now goes to our Presbytery's Committee on Ministry for their August 2017 meeting, where they will review it and approve it (hopefully!!) After we are notified of their approval, we will be allowed to put together the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC). The PNC should be comprised of folks who represent the diversity of Ogden Presbyterian, so please consider whether you feel called to serve on this vital committee. As well, be prayerful about who should be on the Committee to represent the overall needs of the congregation. Once constituted, the PNC will then complete the church's Ministry Information Form, which will be distributed to pastors looking for a new call. Then the interview process will begin. At the same time as the PNC is doing its work, we will be working through the next 2 steps in the interim process:

3. Allowing Needed Leadership Change, empowering new leaders

A change of pastoral leadership often precipitates changes in the lay leadership as well. Also, as a church becomes aware of an emerging new identity, leadership changes follow naturally. Because there are several kinds of power exerted by leaders in a congregation, changing members of Session is only a part of this transition. A change in pastoral leadership affords the opportunity for some who have been followers to step forward. Older leaders may take a less active role while new persons become more involved.

4. Renewing denominational linkages

This happens more or less naturally, as the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry becomes involved in the life of the church as a "church in transition." It is comforting during times of uncertainty to be able to turn to the larger church, to printed resources and human resources. It helps to know that we are not alone—that, in addition to the care and concern of God, we also have fellow human beings to turn to.

A few thoughts about the Mission Statement: it is not perfect, but it is very appropriate to where we are as a congregation and sums up well who we are and what we are called to do. This statement cannot include everything we have talked about recently, or all the information the Mission Study Team compiled. The team will give all that to the PNC as a vital aid to their work. As you read the statement below, yes, we are keeping the statement that is on most things already about being and making disciples: *Our purpose is to equip ourselves and others to be disciples of Christ as we seek God's will for our church and beyond*. That is more of a <u>Vision</u> Statement than a <u>Mission</u> Statement. That Vision Statement is more overarching and can withstand the test of time. Because it is broad, it will be true 5, 10, even 50 years from now. The Vision Statement stands above and beyond the current culture and climate we find ourselves in. The Mission Statement, on the other hand, is more geared to addressing the current situation/time we are living in — it may only be valid for 3-5 years. The Mission Statement addresses NOW: Who we are right now, who is around us right now, what God is calling us to do right now. Thank you to everyone who worked hard on this, including the team listed above, Brandon who typed up so much stuff for us, and all of you who gave vital and important input throughout the process. If you have thoughts, please contact someone from the team.


LOOKING FOR A SUMMER MOVIE?

BOOK REVIEW: FERVENT by Priscilla Shirer



The Discipleship Committee is providing a book review in upcoming issues of the *Oracle* to introduce our friends to quality Christian books that we have read and recommend. If you have read a book that you would like to review or endorse, we invite you to contact a member of our committee to make arrangements. This month's review is for *Fervent* by Priscilla Shirer.



Priscilla Shirer, lead actress in the movie *War Room*, subtitles her book *Fervent* as "A Woman's Battle Plan for Serious, Specific, and Strategic Prayer." Make no mistake, she says, this is NOT a book *about* prayer; this is a book for those who are ready to get on their knees and fight for their lives and loved ones by... praying. Shirer warns her readers that they are in the midst of a war that will require their best efforts and a clear understanding of the weapons God puts at their disposal to assure victory. Throughout the book she covers every area of her reader's life, including "Your Family (Fortifying the Lives of Those You Love)", "Your Past

(Ending the Reign of Guilt, Shame, and Regret)", "Your Hurts (Turning Bitterness to Forgiveness", and seven other topics. Included in the back of the book are 16 blank prayer

cards for readers to write down their own specific prayers to keep and pray over. If you are searching for a way to recharge your prayer life, grow spiritually, and see the results of effective praying, then this book is worth checking out. It is currently available from Amazon in paperback for \$10.70. (Review by Pat Rowe)


