# "The Present"

If any of you frequent Facebook, there is a good chance that at least one of your friends has shared a video clip entitled, "The Present." It is a short animation by a group of young students, all of whom were offered jobs at Disney/Pixar after the video went viral.

It opens with a young boy who is sitting on the couch in his living room, engrossed in his favorite video game. His mother comes walking through the front door, apologizing for getting home later than she had planned, and puts a large box on the table in front of him. He gets upset, for the box blocks his view of the tv screen. He starts to wonder about what could be in the box, but his focus remains on his game.

His mother opens up the blinds, remaking what a beautiful day it was. But her son remains glued to the tv, adjusting for the change of lighting in the room. The telephone rings, and before she answers, she asks him, "Why don't you open the present I got you?" He pauses the game, and looks at the box, confused. Deciding to open it, he begins to lift one of the flaps. Out pops a puppy, much to his delight... until he notices that the pup is missing its front left paw. He tosses the pup on the floor, exclaiming "you've gotta be kidding me!," swats the box off the table, and goes back to his game.

The pup, trying to get the boy's attention, goes over to his side and starts barking. The boy shoves him away with his foot, saying "get lost." The pup, now on its back, sees a ball underneath a cabinet on the other side of the room. It gets up, and starts trying to run after it, and stumbles. It gets back up, and then stumbles again. The boy shrugs it off as pathetic. The pup finally gets over to the cabinet, and runs directly into it. After getting up yet again, it manages to fetch the ball, and brings it over to the boy's side. The boy kicks it aside, not wanting to be interrupted from his gameplay, and the game is on...

The boy had kicked the ball into the box he had flung off the table. As the pup goes to get it, it turns over on top of it, and the pup runs around inside the box, crashing into things. The boy begins to be slightly amused, but quickly diverts his attention back to his game. The pup eventually frees itself, and the boy watches as the pup slowly brings the ball back over to his side. The pup just sits there, looking up at the boy. The boy looks back. Even though the pup has trouble getting around, it is determined to have fun and play.

The boy decides that the pup might not be so bad after all, and decides to head outside and play fetch with his new friend. As he gets up off the couch, he has to grab his two crutches. As he yells up to his mother that they're going outside to play, we see that he is missing his left leg below the knee. It took someone with a similar situation to show him that even though it may not be easy, his lack of a lower limb doesn't have to be a disability to having fun.

So what "disabilities" do we have that prevent us from truly living life, or worshipping God? What excuses do we make? What are we actually missing out on by doing so? God knows that we have our own challenges that we walk with... but He knows that we are capable of getting through them. He gave us the ultimate gift of His unfailing love and mercy, and the victory over death because of the cross. He's paid our every debt. He wants us to live and to share our blessings with others. Go be a present to someone else.



### A LITTLE TRIVIA ABOUT TWO YOKED CHRUCHES

Recently a friend shared some history about OPC being yoked to Chili Presbyterian Church. Here is the story:

During 1948, the Presbytery encouraged OPC and the First Presbyterian Church of Chili to enter into a yoked ministry. Neither church could afford a full-time pastor, and the rationale was that a shared pastorate would be better than each church depending upon "supplies". Following approvals and with minimal pulpit committee involvement on the part of either church, the Rev. Earl Bloxham was called to serve. He had completed his tour of duty in the military and wanted to re-establish his ministry calling. (He was not a chaplain in the army but a line officer.) OPC provided the manse where he and his family lived.

Perhaps Rev. Bloxham had not adjusted to civilian life, but he became very frustrated with both congregations because they had difficulty in following his "orders." Regardless of the cause, blame or design, a process to dissolve the yoked arrangement was nearly unanimously supported by both churches.




