He put total trust in you - in the desert and even unto death – a death which secured our salvation. For that we are deeply thankful. So, here in this holy time of celebration, here at the sacred feast prepared for us, we would speak of that mystery we call faith:
- P: We remember Christ's death; We remember Christ's resurrection; We remember Christ will come again in glory.
- L: God of Love, let your Holy Spirit move in power and love over us and over these earthly gifts of bread and wine.
