Preparations for General Assembly

I spent the first part of last week in Louisville preparing for the GA 222 meeting in Portland, OR in June. This will be my time to serve as a Commissioner, so I am very excited to participate in our process of discernment and decision making. I will be serving as Moderator of the Middle East Issues Committee, which will keep me very busy. The leadership team for the Committee spend several hours planning together, seeking to provide the best committee experience possible. I am hopeful that the committee process will be open and allow time for serious prayerful deliberation, as well as welcoming a diversity of viewpoints through open hearings and the voices of the overture advocates.

Jim Renfrow, who by then will be our Presbytery Moderator (election at our May meeting), will be serving on The Way Forward Committee, focusing on how we, as a national church, make constitutional changes, and the relationship between Presbyterian Mission Agency and the Office of the General Assembly.

Sylvia Fox, Ruling Elder from First Pittsford, will be on the Immigration and Environmental Issues Committee, which will consider overtures concerning climate change and divestment from the Fossil Fuel Industry, as well as the status of refugees and persons who have been internally displaced.

Sarah Noble-Moag, Ruling Elder from Covington, has been assigned to the Mission Coordination Committee, which focuses on Mission programs authorized by the General Assembly, the mission budget, PC(USA) vision and goals, initiatives on church growth, and the 1001 New Worshipping Communities program.

Our Young Adult Advisory Delegate (YAAD), **Zachary Caloritis**, a member of Ogden PC, and a student at Grove City College, will serve on Church Polity and Ordered Ministry. Zach can anticipate spending a good deal of time with the Book of Order, considering proposals to amend the Form of Government and the Rules of Discipline.

Our Commissioners will meet with colleagues from Western New York and Geneva Presbyteries later in May, when our YAADs will be available, for orientation to the GA experience. We look forward to both serving the assembly and to spending time interpreting the decision of GA 222 to our Presbytery and our churches when we return. Please hold all of us, and the entire Assembly, in prayer from June 18-25.


