I have been here now as your Interim Pastor for almost 4 months. Being with you has been very encouraging for me. Thank you for that. My family and I have been welcomed in and we appreciate that. Your hospitality has been excellent. But now I have a favor to ask.

One of my early mentors was a brilliantly compassionate man named Phil Mitchell. Out of all the wise and important things he told me, the most important was this: "*Life is lived in relationship.*" Life is lived in relationship.

Sisters and brothers, that is simply brilliant. That is, indeed, a core statement. I believe that statement goes directly to the heart of who we are as created beings. Everything we do is in relationships. Everything. Whether it is in relationship to another person, to God, to ourselves, or to God's creation, every action we take is in relationship with someone or something. #### FINANCE COMMITTEE






#### **Deacon News**
