

November is probably most well-known for being the month which holds the wonderful holiday of "Thanksgiving" and the idea of expressing gratitude for the blessings we have. Along those lines, did you know that "Gratitude" is actually considered a Spiritual Discipline? Gratitude, when practiced on a regular basis, draws us closer to our God and increases our awareness of God's presence in our daily lives. That's a nice thing to have in our lives!

So, I have a challenge for everyone here at Ogden Presbyterian for the month of November: make November 2017 a *Month of Daily Gratitude*. That is, I am asking you to take time out every day (it can be as simple as a minute or less) and give thanks for something or someone or some blessing in your life. I suggest you keep a written record of your daily "thanksgiving" by listing all the days of the month and then for each day write down one thing/person/situation you are thankful for. It is common to find yourself more positive, happier, and closer of God as you regularly give thanks for the many blessings you have in your life. Try it and see what happens. Feel free to let me know how it's going throughout the month. I'll be doing it!

Those who can use a particular service can pick up a slip that matches their need and contact the donor to arrange details. 
STITCHIN' FOR MISSION

BOOK REVIEW

The Discipleship Committee's book review for this month is "A Religion of One's Own" by Thomas Moore, which is available on Amazon.

The choice of this book was influenced by the subtitle: "A Guide to Creating a Personal Spirituality in a Secular World," and some confusion about the terms "spiritual" and "secular." Thomas Moore has written 13 books; lived as a monk for 12 years; is a musician, psychotherapist, and university professor; and holds a PhD in Religion from Syracuse University.


Moore believes that traditional religion needs an overhaul, and challenges traditional religious folk to create their own personal religion grounded in "an intelligent, openhearted approach to life." He provides ten steps in which to achieve this personal religion. You will have to read the book to find out what they are.

Something that is a part of Moore's "religious humanist" vision is also a part of our

vision at OPC: to understand the true meaning of community and be peacemakers and healers in our homes and neighborhoods. He states that four out of five people in the world are affiliated with an organized religion but they yearn to become more spiritual. They want to reach out. In this book he discusses how this might be achieved.

Moore also suggests that many problems in our culture and world are, in part, the result of the weakening of formal religions that emphasize fundamentalism and meaningless rituals. His final message in the book was to have a respect for both the riches of religion and role of spirituality, and he would urge us as disciples to embrace all the possibilities our religion offers as we head into the future.

Next month we will review how another author explains the concepts of "spiritual" and "secular." "A Religion of One's Own" is recommended reading for anyone wanting to explore spirituality and its role in your personal religious experience. The book will be on the Oak Room library shelf.


Deacon News
