

*INVITATION TO THE LORD'S TABLE

L: The Lord God invites us all to this Holy, Sacred Feast. As we gather, we remember all our sisters and brothers from above and below the equator, from the North and from Down Under, from every time zone around the globe. As today's sunlight inches across land and sea Christians gather to celebrate their place in God's family. They gather to celebrate God seeking them out, coming to them – the Word become Flesh. All are invited and all are welcome. Come, for the meal is ready! As we celebrate this Holy Meal this day, we remember our unity in Christ, and our unity with all our sisters and brothers across the globe.

*THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

- L: The Lord be with you.
- P: And also with you.
- L: Lift up your hearts.
- P: We lift them up to the Lord.
- L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. P: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- L: We gather today from the busyness of life to receive strength.
- P: We come as a people of God to grow through breaking the bread and drinking the cup.
- L: We are a global church with a global task to bring love and joy.
- P: Through this sacrament, we receive power to be faithful in love to serve the people of the world.
- L: Creator God, you created for yourself a world filled with diversity and blessed by your breath of life. Rainbow colors bloom in spring, summer breezes bring garden delight, and now as autumn comes our way we see the work of your paintbrush upon every face and tree. In mercy, while we still held to the chains of our winter, of pride, self-righteousness, and historic egos you loved us steadfastly and delivered us as babes to reflect the beauty and your grace, to bring us into a community of love, hope, and peace. And so, with all your people on earth in every place where two or more are gathered in your name and all the company of heaven who have gone before us we praise your name and join their unending hymn:
- P: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of love and hope, heaven and earth are full of vour glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.
- L: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. Your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, and to announce that the time had come when you would save your people. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with many, particularly sinners. By his

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

- L: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ that we, together as a new creation and a new community around the globe may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.
