Friends,

I've been thinking a lot about "compassion" lately. At the CREDO Conference I attended back in May, I worked on my Rule of Life. A "Rule of Life" for us at the conference was a set of goals/practices we wanted for our lives. We worked very hard to understand who we were as individuals and how we wanted our lives to be. For me, the number one goal/practice of my Rule was: *To think, speak, act with compassion*. What this means for me is to be (become) a person for whom *compassion* is the deepest characteristic which drives my behavior: how I think, speak, act. Compassion to me is caring deeply for others in a way that I am encouraging, loving, uplifting, and not hurtful. It is a way of being in which I lift others up, show my caring for them, avoid saying or doing hurtful things, and work to bring them peace and joy. It means giving people the benefit of the doubt.

Needless to say, fully living into this has been a challenge. Too often I fall short. At those times, I try to remember the Scriptures and how many times they tell that "Jesus had compassion on..." Those passages remind me of the deep theological and Biblical mandate to live a life of compassion. And while it is true I have fallen short of that, very often I have succeeded. At those times life has felt so satisfying and rich and complete. That is when I feel closest to God in Christ. When I am able to fully live into a life of *thinking, speaking, acting with compassion*, I engage others better, more kindly, more positively. It really is a beautiful way of being and changes lives.

Along the same lines as compassion, in some studying I was doing not too long ago, I came across the rather long and daunting phrase: "*hermeneutic of generosity*". It is a term coined by Dr. Paul Farmer, founder of Partners in Health and an infectious disease specialist who has worked in many poor countries like Haiti. He coined this term to mean the following: "interpreting the intentions, actions and statements of others in a favorable light." Basically, I see this as a compassionate way of living in which we immediately and regularly see others in a positive and hopeful way. It means that when someone says something to us, our first inkling is that what they are saying is positive, hopeful, and said to make us and our lives better (i.e. filled with compassion) — even if it doesn't seem so on the surface. A hermeneutic of generosity leads us to hold others in a positive way, so that what we hear them say or what we see them do sounds and looks like life-giving love. This hermeneutic of generosity is a way of living our lives compassionately so when someone doesn't show up for an appointment that we assume they have a very good reason, and instead of getting angry at them we pray they are okay. It means that when we receive an email that "sounds mean and angry" that we assume they were having trouble putting their thoughts into writing and that we will not read anything negative into what is written. A hermeneutic of generosity helps us see others with the heart of God — a heart that loves first, last, and foremost.

Let me encourage you to practice this hermeneutic of generosity in the upcoming weeks. Before you read your emails, tell yourself that you will interpret everything that is written in a positive light. Before you head off to work, tell yourself that you will give everyone the benefit of the doubt today — in all they say and do. When talking to your spouse or children or friends, assume that they care deeply about you; that you trust and respect them and know that what they say or do at this moment comes from a place of love and concern. And then see what happens. See what happens to you — but also see what happens to them. It is amazing what happens when we treat others with compassion.





- Pastor Tedd's "Bible Study 101" will begin on September 21st at 7:00pm. This is the first of 8 sessions.


